I am speaking in support of the Maine State Library's items in the FY25 Supplemental Budget, which appears on pages 73 and 74 of the General Fund Bill Language document.

#### Introduction

Established in 1837, the Maine State Library (MSL) is one of the first cultural agencies created by state government, and throughout our long history, we have had the privilege and honor of "Helping People; Making Maine Libraries Stronger; and Transforming Information into Knowledge" (our mission). The MSL staff and I look forward to continuing to serve the people of Maine, and the allocations represented in the FY25 supplemental budget request will allow us to do so.

#### Initiative Requests

Specific initiatives where we are asking for carry-over approval:

In the FY23 Supplemental Budget request approved by the Legislature, MSL was appropriated \$1.5 million for compact shelving and \$300,000 for furniture and space planning in the renovated

### Dolly Parton's Imagination Library Legislative Update, January 1, 2024

Per MRS Title 27 § 10, the Maine State Library is providing this report to the State Legislature concerning the Imagination Library of Maine.

Thanks to bipartisan agreement and support from Governor Janet Mills (MRS Title 27 § 10), the Maine State Library began a statewide expansion of Dolly Parton's Imagination Library (DPIL) in Maine on December 6, 2023. DPIL mails one high quality, age-appropriate book to children age birth-five, once a month, directly to their homes. National research proves DPIL increases the number of books in children's homes, the amount of time and frequency that parents and caregivers read with their young children, and the level of reading readiness skills that children have when they enter school. The statewide expansion effort includes a \$200,000 investment from the legislature to provide a one-to-one match for local and county level DPIL programs. As of December 2023, there are 13 local programs serving 5,178 children in seven counties. MSL is working with state and local partners to expand that to additional areas, with the goal that all children under 5 in Maine will be eligible to participate within 2 years.

As specified in MRS Title 27 § 10:

- No deposits have been made to the fund. The expenditures made from the fund to date are:
  - o \$2,391.68 in promotional items
  - o \$3,335.03 in travel funds
  - Total spent to date from the DPIL fund: \$5,726.71

MSL will begin providing a one-to-one match for local programs for books and shipping beginning with their January 2024 book order. MSL will also begin to pay for fiscal agent services to DPIL starting in January 2024, to total \$1,000/month.

- No local funding match requirements have been waived.
- Thirteen local Imagination Library programs, called affiliates, are currently operating in Maine:

• Currently there are 5,178 children enrolled in the program. With one book mailed to each child each month, 5,178 books will be mailed in January 2024, the first month that the State of Maine will provide the one-to-one match for the local affiliates.
