Communities without on-staff economic development, planning or emergency management staff will greatly benefit from grant application assistance and education in strategies to maximize dollars for increased federal funds.

Additionally, municipal leaders support the continued funding of the Community Resilience Partnership program and the opportunities that funding can offer. Considering the recent natural disasters across the State, these resilience efforts are more necessary than ever.
