I stand before you this afternoon, as a father, grandfather, uncle, and pastor, appalled at what LD 227 would do to the individuals it is said to support and to our society as a whole.

Children are the most vulnerable section of our society and that is why we make laws to protect them, even from themselves. We mandate seat belts, car seats, air bags, warning labels, etc. etc. We give an age limit for a drivers license and then we make them take a drivers education course.
