I believe that this will clear up language for caregivers, simplifying issues such as:

*Making a delivery,

*Going to tradeshows.

*How about weddings and private functions off-site and on-site?

*confidentiality issues that LD 2215 has. Most notably

Sub-14, #14 Confidentiality D-4, F-1, and the summary #4 talk about "codes may be involved." Which would create municipalities an opportunity to require proper zoning. The Grandfather Clause for existing caregivers from home and / or farmers before 2014 would be in play.

I am also in favor of repealing the Prohibition of Collectives. Collectives are simply a group of people and / or businesses acting together to make your identity or brand a reality, equal decision-making power. This is great for small companies. Again, I'd like to thank you, the VLA Committee, for protecting thousands of small businesses and jobs throughout our state
