

TESTIMONY IN SUPPORT OF LD 1537An Act to Amend the Laws Relating to the Prevention of Perfluoroalkyl and Polyfluoroalkyl Substances Pollution and to Provide Additional Funding

Senator Brenner, Representative Gramlich, and honorable members of the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources:

My name is Julie Ann Smith, and I am the Executive Director of the Maine Farmers Coalition, a collective of progressive farmers deeply committed to ensuring the sustainable growth and protection of Maine's vital farming industry.

Our farmers are grateful to President Jackson for introducing language that provides an exemption for agricultural crop production and protection that is identical to the exemption proposed for veterinarian products. It is equally imperative to protect our food production as it is to protect our livestock and pets.

While we understand the concerns surrounding PFAS and their potential health effects, the proposed exemption has been carefully worded to ensure it is based on a thorough risk assessment process, utilizing the vast resources of the FDA, USDA, EPA, and Maine's Board of Pesticide Control. Crop protectants with any level of PFAS contamination are currently banned through federal and state legislation. The EPA has implemented a PFAS roadmap that is pursuing a comprehensive approach to proactively prevent PFAS from entering air, land, and water at levels that can adversely impact human health and the environment. This would ensure that farmers are still able to grow and protect their crops and strike a balance between protecting the environment and ensuring food security for all.
