## Dylan Griffin, University of Maine at Farmington Student (Saco) Testimony in Support of Funding in the FY26-27 Biennial Budget for the University of Maine System (LD 210, Page A-636)

Good morning, Senators Rotundo and Rafferty, Representatives Gattine and Murphy, and members of the Appropriations and Education Committees.

My name is Dylan Griffin, and I am from Saco, Maine. I am a Senior at the University of Maine at Farmington. I plan to graduate this coming May with a degree in Health Education with a focus in Physical Education. I will have also completed a minor in coaching.

My time at UMF, and within the University of Maine System, has been as great as I could have ever imagined.
