TESTIMONY REGARDING

L.D. 396

An Act to Provide for a Later Starting Time for High Schools

Senator Rafferty, Representative Murphy and members of the Education and Cultural Affairs Committee. I am Dave Keaton, Executive Director of Maine Administrators of Career & Technical Education, testifying on behalf of the CTE Directors of the Maine Administrators of Career & Technical Education (MACTE). MACTE would like to address LD 396 as we are neither for or against this bill.

This bill requires that, beginning with the 2026-2027 school year, each school administrative unit ensure that its secondary schools' school days start no earlier than 8:30 a.m. Our MACTE CTE Directors have strong concerns that LD 396 would hamper Maine CTEs from continuing to train our next generation of Maine skilled workforce:

- We consider this is a Local control issue
- 8:30 start time for all (no earlier than or later) does this allow for dissimilar start times
- Transportation concerns at a time of scarce drivers and expensive gas
- Impact on local employers who rely on high school help after school
- Can we guarantee 350 hours of CTE instruction?
- Minimal gains for schools currently using later starts
- Possible sports conflicts in the afternoon sessions
- Time loss would be compounded when high schools have early releases

We look forward to discussing this matter with all of you in future work sessions.
