Good Shepherd Food Bank of Maine testimony to the Joint Standing Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry in support of LD 415, An Act to Support Hunger Prevention in Maine.

Good morning Senator Talbot Ross, Representative Pluecker, and members of the Joint Standing Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry,

My name is Heather Paquette and I am the President of Good Shepherd Food Bank of Maine. Mainers Feeding Mainers is a Food Bank initiative that distributes nutritious foods to community pantries and neighbors experiencing food insecurity; provides a reliable source of income in advance of the growing season to nearly a hundred Maine farmers; and intentionally invests in the Maine agricultural sector.

Since this impactful public/private partnership began in July 2010, the state of Maine has enabled the purchase and distribution of more than 28.8 million pounds of fresh Maine produce to households experiencing food insecurity across our state.

I want to express our gratitude to Governor Mills, Commissioner Beal, and the current and previous legislatures, for investing \$1M each year in Mainers Feeding Mainers. DACF allocates these funds to us, and we pass on every cent to Mainers Feeding Mainers partners. I also want to thank Representative Annie Graham for her leadership and partnership on this bill.

LD 415 respectfully requests an additional \$1M per year of state investment in Mainers Feeding Mainers. This brings the total state investment in the program to \$2M annually, and Good Shepherd Food Bank will continue to raise and invest donor dollars. DACF funds are dedicated entirely to produce, while donor dollars allow us to purchase and distribute additional produce, seafood, local meat, grain, milk, cheese, eggs, and sauces from local producers.

The state set ambitious goals of ending hunger in Maine by 2030 by strengthening our response to food insecurity today and preventing food insecurity tomorrow, and increasing the proportion of locally sourced food consumed in the state to 30 percent. Mainers Feeding Mainers directly contributes to achieving both of these goals, as well as increasing nutrition food to people living in poverty and at higher risk of diet-related disease such as obesity and diabetes.

Our commitment to Mainers Feeding Mainers is unwavering. While sourcing produce from Philadelphia, Boston, and Canada can cost as little as \$.15 to \$0.35 per pound, we invest \$0.65



per pound in Maine produce because we believe in investing in our local economy and supporting our community's farmers.

We understand the budgetary challenges you are facing; and at the Food Bank, we're facing our own. We're working within budgetary constraints that are also being experienced in nonprofits across the state and across the country. While we continued to be focused on fundraising, it is not realistic to expect that will pace with increased need and cost. Like you, we are managing our expenses carefully while ensuring that our financial stewardship aligns with our values. Our success, built on trust and partnership with the State of Maine, is fueled by a shared vision for a resilient and thriving future in our state.

One in eight people in Maine face hunger, including one in five children. This represents 13 percent of the state's population, compared to 11 percent last year. We are tasked with providing more food for more people with fewer resources.

My colleagues at food banks in other states are envious of our positive working relationship with elected officials. We do not take this for granted. I want to conclude by echoing my gratitude for your work and ask you for your support of LD 415.

Good Shepherd Food Bank Mainers Feeding Mainers Program Work Plan For Contract Period April 1, 2025, to March 31, 2026

Narrative Summary of the Approach to Meeting Program Requirements

Good Shepherd Food Bank's Mainers Feeding Mainers (MFM) program was formed 15 years ago with the dual purpose of supporting Maine's food production infrastructure, while also providing nutritious, fresh food to Maine's statewide emergency food distribution network. The program has grown and expanded to include 93 Maine farmers and food producers, and currently provides food to emergency relief organizations in all 16 counties of the state, totaling 600 emergency food distribution organizations.

Since its inception, MFM has expanded beyond getting local produce to food pantries. Through collaborations with processors such as Pineland Dairy Farm, Oakhurst Dairy, Maine Coast Fishermen's Association, W.A. Bean and Maine Grains, cheese, milk, fish, flour, oats, bread and meat products are now available for our network agencies. We also remain committed to partnering with underserved farmers and producers especially BIPOC farmers. MFM works with more than 22 BIPOC growers who provide both traditional Maine crops and culturally relevant crops for BIPOC communities. This past grant period these growers provided more than 145,000 lbs. of culturally relevant corps that were distributed directly from their farms to community pantries who serve our ethnic population. This is a 190% increase over what they produced in 2023.

Since Mainers Feeding Mainers was launched, the program has influenced a fundamental change to the nutritional quality of food distributed to Network Agencies. Using MFM as a starting point, GSFB has steadily increased the amount of healthy produce distributed to food insecure Mainers across all GSFB food channels. In 2010, GSFB's fresh produce distribution totaled just **2 million pounds**. In 2024, GSFB's fresh produce distribution totaled **17.2 million pounds**, or a 760% increase. During this time, the percentage of healthy fruits and vegetables relative to total food distributed has increased from 19% to 39%.

Mainers Feeding Mainers will soon begin its 15th growing season since the program was created. In looking back over the past 14 years, we have much to celebrate. The program began with 9 Maine farmers/producers and today has more than 90. Since its inception, we have distributed more than 26 million lbs. of fresh, local produce to more than 600 food pantries, meal sites, school pantries, and healthcare partners in Maine. With the help of the Department of Agriculture, we have been able to invest more than \$13.9 million back into the Maine AG economy.

Goals for New Contract Period

For the full FY2025-26 contract period, MFM expects to source and distribute 3+ million pounds of Maine fruits, vegetables, seafood, dairy, and other products.

For the FY2023-24 contract period, (April 1, 2023, thru March 31, 2024), the Mainers Feeding Mainers program has sourced and distributed 3.7 million pounds of Maine fruits, vegetables, seafood, dairy, and other local products. Of this total distribution, 1.4 million pounds were purchased with funds from the current DACF contract.

MFM expects to distribute product primarily through our traditional food pantry and other emergency food distribution partners (80 - 90%), followed by school and youth programs (5% - 10%), health care organizations (0% - 5%), and other miscellaneous network partners (0 - 5%).

Determining food distribution channel participants

Funding from the Maine Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry (DACF) requires that food purchased with DACF funds is provided to partnering food pantries at no charge and that the food will be made available in every county.

Local produce is distributed through two channels: Farm-to-Warehouse, where farm partners supply products to the GSFB's warehouses for broad distribution, and Farm-to-Pantry, where farm partners directly supply products to local food pantries for community distribution by the food pantry. 40% of MFM products are delivered via the Farm-to-Pantry model, and the remaining 60% are delivered via the Farm-to-Warehouse model.

The Farm-to-Pantry channel allows MFM to contract with smaller growers and to distribute product more efficiently to network partners located further from the GSFB's distribution

centers. Currently, 60 of our farms follow the Farm-to-Pantry distribution model and are serving 200 network partners with product directly from farms.

Farm—to-Warehouse participants are typically larger farms that provide products such as root crops that can be stored for extended periods of time. These Farm-to-Warehouse farms may either deliver to GSFB's Auburn and Hampden facilities, or GSFB may pick up product at these farms.

Identifying farm partners for the Farm-to-Pantry model is more complicated and starts by identifying the areas in Maine that have the highest percentage of food insecure individuals. The MFM Program Manager then determines if existing Network Agencies have interest and capacity to distribute fresh product in the identified communities. If appropriate Network Agencies are identified, the MFM Program Manager solicits local farmers in those areas to determine interest in becoming a MFM Farm-to-Pantry partner. Once a farm has confirmed their willingness to participate, the local food Network Agencies are partnered with each farmer.

Farmers may also apply to become a MFM partner thru GSFB's website.

Applications are reviewed by the MFM Program Manager to determine if the farm is in an area/region of the state that is underserved, or if additional farm partners are needed in that community.

Applications may not be accepted due to several reasons. Reasons include lack of need for additional farm capacity in farmer's community, lack of network partners in their area, low demand for products produced, or inability to negotiate mutually acceptable pricing.

Calendar of Key Actions and Events

The MFM Program Manager meets with the farm partners during the winter and early spring to establish written commitments in the form of flexible Letters of Understanding (LOU) with each farm partner. These LOUs specify the products to be grown, estimated volumes and prices, and delivery methods. The Food Bank guarantees the total revenue stated in the LOU, unless a farmer is unable to provide any product.

Throughout the growing season, the MFM Program Manager stays in regular contact with each farmer. GSFB will amend the LOU's to meet the farmer's needs, if product availability or market pricing changes, or the farm has product available to donate.

Farms invoice the Food Bank as product is transferred (either via delivery, pick-up, or partner delivery). The Food Bank pays these invoices typically within 15 days of invoice receipt. Farm-to-Pantry produce is delivered according to a schedule agreed upon between the farmer and the partner agency. Farm-to-Warehouse produce is made available to all network partners via the GSFB online shopping portal. Regardless of distribution channel, all MFM produce is provided at no cost to partners.

Explanation of Budget

MFM is supported thru a combination of \$1 million of funding from DACF, supplemented with funding from GSFB donors, as well as food donations from MFM farm partners.

1. Purchase of Maine produce

For the year ending March 31, 2026, Good Shepherd Food Bank plans to source 3 million pounds of fresh fruits and vegetables from Maine farms at a total cost of \$2,275,000. DACF funding in the amount of \$1,000,000 will be used to fund a portion of produce purchases, with the balance of funding coming from GSFB donors. Approximately 1.3 million pounds (40%) will be delivered via the Farm-to-Pantry channel, while approximately 1.7 million pounds (60%) will be distributed thru the Farm-to-Warehouse model.

2. Purchase of non-produce sourced from Maine farms

In addition to produce, MFM will purchase seafood, local meats, grains, milk, cheese, eggs, and processed shelf-stable sauces from local producers during this time. These purchases will total 400,000 pounds, at an expected cost of \$500,000. No DACF funds will be used to purchase non-produce items.

3. Direct program salaries and benefits

All non-food MFM costs, including salaries, benefits, and other direct and indirect costs, will be paid for using non-DACF funds.

Good Shepherd Food Bank Mainers Feeding Mainers Program Work Plan For Contract Period April 1, 2025, to March 31, 2026

Narrative Summary of the Approach to Meeting Program Requirements

Good Shepherd Food Bank's Mainers Feeding Mainers (MFM) program was formed 15 years ago with the dual purpose of supporting Maine's food production infrastructure, while also providing nutritious, fresh food to Maine's statewide emergency food distribution network. The program has grown and expanded to include 93 Maine farmers and food producers, and currently provides food to emergency relief organizations in all 16 counties of the state, totaling 600 emergency food distribution organizations.

Since its inception, MFM has expanded beyond getting local produce to food pantries. Through collaborations with processors such as Pineland Dairy Farm, Oakhurst Dairy, Maine Coast Fishermen's Association, W.A. Bean and Maine Grains, cheese, milk, fish, flour, oats, bread and meat products are now available for our network agencies. We also remain committed to partnering with underserved farmers and producers especially BIPOC farmers. MFM works with more than 22 BIPOC growers who provide both traditional Maine crops and culturally relevant crops for BIPOC communities. This past grant period these growers provided more than 145,000 lbs. of culturally relevant corps that were distributed directly from their farms to community pantries who serve our ethnic population. This is a 190% increase over what they produced in 2023.

Since Mainers Feeding Mainers was launched, the program has influenced a fundamental change to the nutritional quality of food distributed to Network Agencies. Using MFM as a starting point, GSFB has steadily increased the amount of healthy produce distributed to food insecure Mainers across all GSFB food channels. In 2010, GSFB's fresh produce distribution totaled just **2 million pounds**. In 2024, GSFB's fresh produce distribution totaled **17.2 million pounds**, or a 760% increase. During this time, the percentage of healthy fruits and vegetables relative to total food distributed has increased from 19% to 39%.

Mainers Feeding Mainers will soon begin its 15th growing season since the program was created. In looking back over the past 14 years, we have much to celebrate. The program began with 9 Maine farmers/producers and today has more than 90. Since its inception, we have distributed more than 26 million lbs. of fresh, local produce to more than 600 food pantries, meal sites, school pantries, and healthcare partners in Maine. With the help of the Department of Agriculture, we have been able to invest more than \$13.9 million back into the Maine AG economy.

Goals for New Contract Period

For the full FY2025-26 contract period, MFM expects to source and distribute 3+ million pounds of Maine fruits, vegetables, seafood, dairy, and other products.

For the FY2023-24 contract period, (April 1, 2023, thru March 31, 2024), the Mainers Feeding Mainers program has sourced and distributed 3.7 million pounds of Maine fruits, vegetables, seafood, dairy, and other local products. Of this total distribution, 1.4 million pounds were purchased with funds from the current DACF contract.

Determining food distribution channel participants

Funding from the Maine Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry (DACF) requires that food purchased with DACF funds is provided to partnering food pantries at no charge and that the food will be made available in every county.

Local produce is distributed through two channels: Farm-to-Warehouse, where farm partners supply products to the GSFB's warehouses for broad distribution, and Farm-to-Pantry, where farm partners directly supply products to local food pantries for community distribution by the food pantry. 40% of MFM products are delivered via the Farm-to-Pantry model, and the remaining 60% are delivered via the Farm-to-Warehouse model.

The Farm-to-Pantry channel allows MFM to contract with smaller growers and to distribute product more efficiently to network partners located further from the GSFB's distribution

centers. Currently, 60 of our farms follow the Farm-to-Pantry distribution model and are serving 200 network partners with product directly from farms.

Farm—to-Warehouse participants are typically larger farms that provide products such as root crops that can be stored for extended periods of time. These Farm-to-Warehouse farms may either deliver to GSFB's Auburn and Hampden facilities, or GSFB may pick up product at these farms.

Identifying farm partners for the Farm-to-Pantry model is more complicated and starts by identifying the areas in Maine that have the highest percentage of food insecure individuals. The MFM Program Manager then determines if existing Network Agencies have interest and capacity to distribute fresh product in the identified communities. If appropriate Network Agencies are identified, the MFM Program Manager solicits local farmers in those areas to determine interest in becoming a MFM Farm-to-Pantry partner. Once a farm has confirmed their willingness to participate, the local food Network Agencies are partnered with each farmer.

Farmers may also apply to become a MFM partner thru GSFB's website.

Applications are reviewed by the MFM Program Manager to determine if the farm is in an area/region of the state that is underserved, or if additional farm partners are needed in that community.

Applications may not be accepted due to several reasons. Reasons include lack of need for additional farm capacity in farmer's community, lack of network partners in their area, low demand for products produced, or inability to negotiate mutually acceptable pricing.

Calendar of Key Actions and Events

The MFM Program Manager meets with the farm partners during the winter and early spring to establish written commitments in the form of flexible Letters of Understanding (LOU) with each farm partner. These LOUs specify the products to be grown, estimated volumes and prices, and delivery methods. The Food Bank guarantees the total revenue stated in the LOU, unless a farmer is unable to provide any product.

Throughout the growing season, the MFM Program Manager stays in regular contact with each farmer. GSFB will amend the LOU's to meet the farmer's needs, if product availability or market pricing changes, or the farm has product available to donate.

Farms invoice the Food Bank as product is transferred (either via delivery, pick-up, or partner delivery). The Food Bank pays these invoices typically within 15 days of invoice receipt. Farm-to-Pantry produce is delivered according to a schedule agreed upon between the farmer and the partner agency. Farm-to-Warehouse produce is made available to all network partners via the GSFB online shopping portal. Regardless of distribution channel, all MFM produce is provided at no cost to partners.

Explanation of Budget

MFM is supported thru a combination of \$1 million of funding from DACF, supplemented with funding from GSFB donors, as well as food donations from MFM farm partners.

1. Purchase of Maine produce

For the year ending March 31, 2026, Good Shepherd Food Bank plans to source 3 million pounds of fresh fruits and vegetables from Maine farms at a total cost of \$2,275,000. DACF funding in the amount of \$1,000,000 will be used to fund a portion of produce purchases, with the balance of funding coming from GSFB donors. Approximately 1.3 million pounds (40%) will be delivered via the Farm-to-Pantry channel, while approximately 1.7 million pounds (60%) will be distributed thru the Farm-to-Warehouse model.

2. Purchase of non-produce sourced from Maine farms

In addition to produce, MFM will purchase seafood, local meats, grains, milk, cheese, eggs, and processed shelf-stable sauces from local producers during this time. These purchases will total 400,000 pounds, at an expected cost of \$500,000. No DACF funds will be used to purchase non-produce items.

3. Direct program salaries and benefits

All non-food MFM costs, including salaries, benefits, and other direct and indirect costs, will be paid for using non-DACF funds.
