Being restrained makes a person feel not like a person, it can make a situation worse. Restraints happen when another person forces their body on yours. When I feel forced to do something, I know it's not going to work.

I believe there are better strategies that could be used before restraint but when restraints are apart of someone's plan, those other strategies might get ignored.

Listen to the experiences of myself and other self-advocates who are telling you this isn't the right way to treat someone. I urge you to vote in favor of LD 769.
