The alert for finding him and the seriousness took too long to really get started, and taken with the urgency it needed. Please pass this bill. No family, or children, whether adult or not should have to endure the pain of not knowing. Graham's circumstances are heartbreaking and I believe could have been prevented. Thank you for your time.
