

## LD 965, "An Act to Require the Automatic Repealing of Agency Rules"

A government that regularly evaluates and updates its regulations is better positioned to adapt to changing circumstances and meet the needs of its citizens. This bill's emphasis on periodic review aligns with the principles of smaller government by preventing the unchecked expansion of regulatory authority.
