Having stated that, I would like to now draw our attention to the proposal at large. For years the vast majority of our providers have given excellent care to those in need. It is my opinion that the proposed change to our regulations is a case of the tail wagging the dog. What has not worked well, is the presumption that the regulators are not provided with the resources and the means to adjudicate appropriate actions against those providers who are not achieving the standards of care. Therefor I propose the true focus of regulatory change should not be on the tightening of the care standards but on the ability for the State to hold violators of the existing regulations to task. The very act of the proposed stringent changes is an afront to the majority of providers who give excellent, safe, and compassionate care.
