Testimony in Support of LD 1044 An Act to Clarify the Qualifying Use of Tax Increment Financing for Extension of a Development District April 2, 2025

- 3. **Providing Long-Term Economic Stability:** The ability to extend TIF districts ensures that municipalities can plan and execute long-term investments in housing and transit that align with Maine's economic and environmental sustainability goals.
- 4. Strengthening Workforce and Economic Growth: Ensuring that workers have access to affordable housing and reliable transportation options supports local businesses, attracts new talent, and creates a more vibrant and economically inclusive state.

As Maine continues to address the interconnected challenges of housing affordability and infrastructure development, this legislation provides a crucial tool for municipalities to build stronger, more sustainable communities.
