Hello and good morning/afternoon,

My name is Hazen Searway, I am a born and raised Mainer and an employee of the Conway Scenic Railroad. I'd like to share why I choose trains and why I work at the Conway Scenic Railroad. I wish to promote the opportunity to grow and support business in Portland, North Conway, and destinations along the Mountain Division's route. My opinion may perhaps be biased; however, my intent in this testimony is to share the ways good would come from the Conway Scenic Railroad running on the Mountain Division Line in Maine.

I believe that railroads in the US are moving back into the spotlight; congested roads and skies do not offer a solution to the growing needs this country faces. There was once a time when this country solely relied upon trains to transport freight and people. The knowledge of how to do so was carefully passed down through the generations. This represents one of the many reasons I chose the Conway Scenic Railroad. My career path before railroading was aviation, and I hold a pilot's certificate with an instrument rating. I deviated from that course due to many of the stresses that come with airline transport. I thought I would try something different, not fully knowing what would come of it.
