Testimony of Representative Arthur Mingo

## L.D. 956, "Resolve, Directing the Department of Transportation to Implement the Recommendation of the Calais Branch Rail Use Advisory Council to Create a Multi-use Trail"

Before the Joint Standing Committee on Transportation

April 4, 2025

Good morning, Senator Nangle, Representative Crafts, and distinguished members of the Joint Standing Committee on Transportation.

My name is Arthur Mingo and I proudly represent House District 9, serving nine beautiful communities of Eastern Washington County. Thank you for the opportunity to testify today on this important bill.

I stand before you today in strong support of LD 956, "Resolve, Directing the Department of Transportation to Implement the Recommendation of the Calais Branch Rail Use Advisory Council to Create a Multi-use Trail."

This initiative is a critical step in completing the trail connection from Ellsworth to Calais, strengthening our position as the northern terminus of the East Coast Greenway. It builds on the success of the Down East Sunrise Trail (DEST) and honors the dedicated work of the Rail Use Advisory Council.

The final 12.26 miles of the deactivated Calais Branch Railroad Corridor—from Ayers Junction Road to Route 1 near Calais—represents the missing link. Converting it into a multi-use trail would extend the DEST, provide an off-road East Coast Greenway route, and offer lasting economic and recreational benefits.

We've already seen the immense success of the rail bed from Ellsworth to Ayers Junction. Thoughtful trail development—removing rails, repairing washouts, improving bridges and culverts, and maintaining a durable gravel base—ensures responsible use while preserving future rail potential if market conditions change.

This project is more than just a trail; it's an economic driver. With full connectivity, Calais could transform into a true recreation destination, much like Aroostook County.
