Madam Chair Carney, madam chair Kuhn, esteemed members of the judiciary committee,

My name is Josh Whitney, I live in Pittston Maine, I am a representative of the King's Coalition for Abolition, and I am in support of LD 975.

I am incredibly disappointed to hear that this bill was pulled from this committee. The 14th amendment to the US Constitution says that all people have the right to life, liberty, and property. 2 years ago, this very committee voted for legislation to kill our children in the womb until birth. Now, when we bring forward a bill to stop the murder of children, it is pulled from committee. The tolerant members of this committee can't even bring this bill forward for consideration.
