Testimony of Rep. James Dill

L.D. 1012 "An Act to Fund the Operations of the University of Maine Cooperative Extension Tick Laboratory" Before the Veterans and Legal Affairs Committee

Senator Hickman, Representative Supica, and distinguished members of the Veterans and Legal Affairs Committee, my name is Jim Dill, and I represent House District 26 and the communities of Bradley, Old Town and Penobscot Nation Voting District. I am here before you today to testify in support of LD 1012 "An Act to Fund the Operations of the University of Maine Cooperative Extension Tick Laboratory".

I'd like to start by thanking Legislature for the ongoing support of \$250,000 for the tick lab. This was an amount that Approps gave to offset the repeal of 15 cents fee on a pesticide container in 2021, some of which went to the tick lab. The goal was to realize around \$600,000 for the lab from the fee. There were issues with assessing the fee and, of course, some people objected to the fee, although it was going to an interesting cause. So, it was repealed and the Governor put \$500,000 in the budget for the lab to offset the loss, but it was cut in half by Approps.

The 15 cents was repealed for a couple of reasons. It was a tax that everyone had to pay- scratch off is again voluntary. It was also quite difficult to determine by UPC code which product was actually a pesticide. I won't elaborate on the whole concept of UPC codes and its issues! This new method of funding is strictly voluntary—a scratch off ticket. So, this is a fairer system.

I'm sure you will hear from someone from BABLO saying that scratch offs have a limited pot, and it is already split 35 ways (or whatever the number of tickets in play are). Adding this ticket will just split the same pot 36 ways, so the funds are lost from where they go now, unless, of course, this new game brings in enough funds to pay for itself. Therefore, there may be a fiscal note.

District 26: Bradley, Old Town and Penobscot Indian Island

Let's explore this. I contend a fiscal note can't be readily determined for the following reasons: It's a \$4 ticket; we don't have one. I don't know why, but the gaming group probably does. So, it will be unique. I talked to many current scratch off players who said they'd most likely hand over a \$5 bill and buy one Tick-it and say give me a dollar one also. Same with a \$10 bill – two \$4s and a \$2 or two \$1s. So, sales could actually increase with other small games.

I've also talked to many non-players who say they would buy Tick-its, because **they hate ticks**, and this is a great cause. How many newbies; how many will they buy; how long will they play??? The proceeds are also initially split 50/50 with the general fund. In about 3 years (December 15, 2028), there will be a report back to the committee to determine how to proceed with the game. The hope is to achieve a minimum of \$350,000 annually to the lab. I must say that most people I've talked to about this new game would prefer all proceeds to go to the tick program.

My one concern with the bill (page 3, Line 3) is under Section 4 D: is further amended to read...

For payment to the Maine Outdoor Heritage Fund pursuant to Title 12, section 10302. I'm not sure why this is here.

Finally, I'd like to introduce you to Simon (at least his current rendition). We hope to do an educational program around Simon. Simon says: "Do a tick check". Simon says: "Wear light colored clothing". You get the gist. The idea is to relate Simon, the educator, back to Simon, the promoter, on the Tick-it. If the connection is made, then perhaps more people will buy the Tick-it. We also hope to produce some animated videos featuring Simon and his Family, with a back ground song.

Perhaps you are familiar with Simon and Garfunkel's song, Scarborough Fair? Well, this song is called Simon's Lair! Here is the first verse comparison:

Simon & Garfunkel

Are you going to Scarborough Fair? Parsley, sage, rosemary and thyme Remember me to one who lives there For once she was a true love of mine Are you going to walk in the woods? Pugsley, Gage, Rosemary, and Lyme Be wary of one who may live there For once she finds you she'll likely dine
