My name is Christopher K. Ring and I am a community member residing in Hartland, Maine. I have recently heard about the proposed bill LD 1751 being referred to the Committee on Educational and Cultural Affairs.

This bill would **require** all teachers at Maine's charter schools to hold a teaching certificate immediately upon hire and it eliminates the current exemption to allow teachers to become certified within 3 years or if the teacher holds an advanced degree, professional certification or possess unique expertise or experience in the relevant curricular area.

This bill would disqualify some highly qualified and exceptional educators from teaching in Maine's charter schools.
