My name is Emma Walsh, and I am a junior at Portland High School. I am here today to speak in favor of the bill to lower the voting age—LD 1446.

Though I am only 16 years old, I have demonstrated extensive civic engagement and involvement. I work in my community, I volunteer, and I advocate for bills such as the one subject in this hearing today. In fact, many of my peers have community responsibilities, jobs, and volunteer through high school clubs and organizations. 16 and 17 year olds are already active members within the State of Maine and in their respective cities or towns—why not further their engagement through allowing them the right to vote?
