Testimony of Michael Scott, President Tuesday, May 12, 2025

LD 1947 – "An Act to Amend the Laws Pertaining to the Maine Public Employees Retirement System"

I'm here to testify in support of LD 1947 as the President of the Professional Fire Fighters of Maine, representing over 1,200 First Responders and their families across the State of Maine. I am writing to express my strong support for LD 1947, particularly its provisions aimed at enhancing flexibility in overpayment reimbursements and reducing quorum requirements. Flexibility in Overpayment Reimbursement

In times when achieving a full quorum can be challenging, this adjustment will enable the board to make timely decisions, thereby preventing delays in crucial matters such as benefit adjustments and policy updates. A more agile decision-making process will enhance the overall effectiveness of the Advisory Board and better serve its members.
