## TESTIMONY BEFORE THE JOINT STANDING COMMITTEE ON ENERGY, UTILITIES & TECHNOLOGY

LD 1967 - Resolve, to Establish the Maine Home Energy Navigator and Coaching Pilot Program

May 15, 2025

Senator Lawrence, Representative Sachs, and members of the Joint Standing Committee on Energy, Utilities & Technology:

LD 1967 is being introduced to help the people of Maine make the most strategic decisions they can about improving their home's efficiency with the resources they have available to them. This Resolve is also an opportunity to ensure that we maximize the reach and impact of public dollars. The bill is inspired by years of experience in building science, weatherization, HVAC and solar contracting, local volunteers doing good by their neighbors and a recognition by the Maine Climate Council that there is a knowledge gap in the public that needs to be addressed.

The Resolve directs the newly formed Office of Community Affairs, in partnership with the Efficiency Maine Trust, the Maine State Housing Authority and the Governor's Energy Office to establish the Maine Home Energy Navigator and Coaching Pilot Program to support energy efficiency of residential properties, enhance consumer protection and expand access to energy assistance programs, particularly for low-income and underserved communities.

From Maine Won't Wait 2.0:

"Establishing an energy coaching program could improve access to energy assistance programs and state and federal funding opportunities. Navigators would help low-income and underserved people and communities understand their options for meeting their energy needs through grants, rebates or other incentives. Program designers and implementers should work with community-based organizations and tribal governments to ensure outreach efforts successfully reach underserved populations."
