Statement in Support of L.D. 1259 and L.D. 1971

Hearing at 1 pm – Room 438, 4th Floor, Capitol Building, Augusta, Maine Monday, May 19, 2025 regarding -

L.D. 1259 prohibits local law enforcement from signing formal agreements with ICE regarding immigration. Ensuring that local law enforcement agencies do not collaborate and cooperate with ICE on immigration enforcement, except in very limited and specific circumstances.

L.D. 1971 which specifically defines and details the relationship between local police departments and ICE.
