

Support for the Amendment to “An Act to Support Nonprofit Organizations by Authorizing the Operation of Electronic Lucky Seven Devices and Similar Sealed Ticket Games.”

Good Morning Senator Hickman, Representative Supica and members of the Veterans and Legal Affairs Committee. The Maine Standardbred Owners and Breeders Association (MSBOA) Board of Directors met and unanimously (7:0) agree that we support the Amendment to LD 1902.
