

## **SPONSOR TESTIMONY IN SUPPORT OF LD 2084**

### **“AN ACT TO AMEND THE LAWS REGULATING TRANSIENT SALES OF HOME REPAIR SERVICES” (EMERGENCY PREAMBLE)**

#### **BEFORE THE JOINT STANDING COMMITTEE ON LABOR**

**PUBLIC HEARING: JANUARY 21, 2026, 10:00 AM**

Good morning, Senator Tipping and my esteemed fellow Members of the Committee on Labor. I am Representative Amy Roeder, and I represent House District 23 representing part of Bangor. I am pleased to be here today as the Sponsor of DPFR’s bill, LD 2084 “An Act to Amend the Laws Regulating Transient Sales of Home Repair Services.”

This bill amends the law for one of the programs administered by the Office of Professional and Occupational Regulation, within the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation, referred to as “OPOR”. As OPOR Director Penny Vaillancourt can explain to you in more detail, this is a technical amendment due to an errant reference to a licensing board in the statute, when there is no board administering this program. This amendment will correct that error and give the OPOR the authority to impose disciplinary sanctions on a license when it is warranted. The emergency preamble reflects that the agency is without the ability to take any final action on pending complaint cases and licensure applications until this issue is resolved.
