

LD 1383 — Ethical Investment & Human Rights One-Minute Public Testimony

Thank you to Senator Baldacci, Representative Salisbury, and the honorable members of the Committee for allowing me to speak today. I work in industries where policy and financial systems directly affect people's daily lives. What I've learned is that money is never neutral — it reflects what we're willing to stand behind. This is also personal for me. My grandmother, Christine Anne Dstroy, is 97 years old. She was born in Worpswede, Germany, and later spent many years leading a peace committee here in Brunswick, Maine. She wrote about the lessons of Nazi Germany, and growing up with her taught me that peace isn't something you inherit — it's something you choose to work for. I support LD 1383 because I believe Maine should hold its public investments to the same ethical standards we expect in our laws and our communities. This isn't about politics for me — it's about accountability, transparency, and long-term leadership. Thank you for your time.
