Thank you for the opportunity to provide our recommendations concerning the Emergency FY13 Supplemental Budget, LR 1045. Included in the Governor's proposals are changes to the FY13 Budget for the Department of the Attorney General, the Judicial Branch and the Maine Commission on Indigent Legal Services. Our recommendations are as follows.

Department of the Attorney General

The Judiciary Committee unanimously supports the proposed budget contained in LR 1045 for the Department of the Attorney General except for Ref# 55. (Approve Ref ## 47, 48, 49, 53, 45 and 51; table Ref #55) The Judiciary Committee tabled Ref # 55 at the request of Attorney General Mills. The proposal reflects a proposed transfer of a position in the tobacco enforcement program from the Department of the Attorney General to the Department of Health and Human Services. Attorney General Mills is reconsidering whether the transfer is necessary, and is in discussions with DHHS Commissioner Mayhew about transferring the position. We support Attorney General Mills' decision to keep the position within the Department of the Attorney General, but will not oppose going forward with the proposed change if the

Attorney General and Commissioner Mayhew agree that doing so will make the tobacco enforcement program the most effective.

Judicial Branch

The Judiciary Committee unanimously supports the E FY13 Supplemental Budget as it affects the Judicial Branch. (Ref ## 373, 375, 377 and Part Z)

Maine Commission on Indigent Legal Services

The Judiciary Committee unanimously supports Ref# 338 that reduces the appropriation for Personal Services within the Maine Commission on Indigent Legal Services (MCILS). In contrast, the Judiciary Committee opposes the \$65,000 cut to the All Other account, identified as Ref # 339. Instead, we unanimously support fully funding the MCILS to cover all the costs necessary to provide the constitutionally required services the Commission was created to ensure are delivered. The MCILS received sufficient funding – through an additional Supplemental Budget appropriation and an emergency allocation crafted by the Governor – for FY12 and was able to enter FY13 with no debts due attorneys. Those instances of additional funding were not, however, built into the Commission's baseline budget for FY13, meaning the MCILS's projected costs would be at least \$1.4 million above what was appropriated for FY13.

It is important that the Legislature as a whole recognize and take responsibility for the constitutionally-required representation of individuals when their liberty is in jeopardy through criminal proceedings or involuntary commitment proceedings - or when the State has started proceedings that may result in the loss of custody of their children. See U.S. Const. amend. VI ("In all criminal prosecutions, the accused shall enjoy the right...to have the assistance of counsel for his defense."); Me Const. art. I, § 6; Gideon v. Wainwright, 372 U.S. 335, 342 (1963) (held that the sixth amendment right to counsel was binding on the states through the due process clause because representation by counsel was "fundamental and essential to a fair trial."); State v. Watson, 2006 ME 80, ¶ 14 ("The right to counsel afforded by article I, section 6 of the Maine Constitution is commensurate with that of the Sixth Amendment of the federal constitution."). If legal representation is not available in these situations, the ultimate result is that the State will not be able to proceed with criminal prosecutions, nor will it be able to protect children who are subject to serious abuse or neglect. We believe this to be an untenable outcome, and strongly support funding to cover the legal representation costs. MCILS estimates that the E FY13 Supplemental Budget should include an additional \$1,787,428 to cover those costs through June 30, 2013.

The Judiciary Committee also recommends that support be provided for enhancing the financial screening capability of the Commission. Financial screeners constructively create revenue by identifying resources that potentially-indigent defendants can contribute to their defense. Enhancing this capability may be accomplished by increasing


the number of financial screeners – there are currently only six, and they usually work in the most populous areas – or by exploring creative ways to provide the screening function, such as through video conferencing, project screeners or contract screeners. The Commission has included this subject on their next agenda, and we support those efforts. We look forward to receiving their recommendations for improving the financial screening process.

In summary, the Judiciary Committee unanimously recommends that the \$65,000 reduction be eliminated (Ref# 339) and an additional appropriation of \$1,787,428 be included. Not included as a funding recommendation at this time is our support for the enhancement of the financial screening capability to free up more funding for additional representation.
