LD 45 - Supplemental Budget for 2009

The Joint Standing Committee on Inland Fisheries and Wildlife voted (9-0) to approve those parts of LD 45 - 2009 Supplemental Budget, that fall within the jurisdiction of our committee except for the initiative (ref. # 571, page 111) that eliminates \$51,545 in funding for the printing of the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 12 and the printing and distribution of boating and ATV law books.

The committee strongly opposes this initiative as law books are a vital component to the management of Maine's fish and wildlife resources. Therefore, we recommend a one-time transfer of \$51,545 from the Inland Fisheries and Wildlife Carrying Balances to restore funding for the printing of Title 12 and certain law books. In order to resolve this issue on an ongoing basis, the committee will provide statutory language to you next week that will authorize the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to charge for law books or abstracts to cover the cost of producing and distributing those items.

The committee has also voted (9-0) to amend LD 45 to authorize the creation of a sportsman motorcycle and trailer specialty plate (draft language attached). Revenues generated from the sale of these specialty plates will be deposited into a fund for the purpose of acquiring property to ensure access for recreational opportunities that are licensed by the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife. Thank you for your consideration of our recommendations.

## Proposed Amendment to LD 45 Supplemental Budget for 2009

# Joint Standing Committee on Inland Fisheries and Wildlife (Voted in 9-0)

## PART?

Sec. 1. 12 MRSA § 10262, is created to read:

## §10262. Outdoor Recreational Access Protection Fund

- 1. Fund established. The Outdoor Recreational Access Protection Fund, referred to in this section as the "fund," is established as a nonlapsing fund administered by the commissioner for the purposes of acquiring real property or an interest in real property necessary to ensure access for recreational opportunities that are licensed under this Part.
- 2. Funding sources. The fund may receive money deposited by the Treasurer of State pursuant to Title 29-A, sections 456-C for the registration of a motorcycle or trailer and any other gift, grant or other source of revenue deposited for that use.
- Sec. 2. 29-A MRSA § 456-C, is amended to read:

## §456-C. SPORTSMAN REGISTRATION PLATES

- 1. Sportsman registration plates. The Secretary of State, upon receiving an application and evidence of payment of the registration fee required by section 501, 511 or 515 and the excise tax required by Title 36, section 1482, shall issue a registration certificate and a set of sportsman plates to be used in lieu of regular registration plates. These plates must bear identification numbers and letters. Vanity plates may not duplicate vanity plates issued in another class of plate. The Secretary of State shall begin issuing sportsmen registration plates by April 1, 2008.
- 2. Initial registration fee. Except as provided in subsection 2-A, and in addition to the regular motor vehicle registration fee prescribed by law, the initial contribution for the sportsman registration plate is \$20, which must be deposited with the Treasurer of State and credited as follows:
  - A. Fourteen dollars to the Boat Launch Facilities Fund established in Title 12, section 10261;
  - B. Five dollars to the Highway Fund for administrative and production costs; and
  - C. One dollar to the Specialty License Plate Fund established under section 469.

- 2-A. Initial registration fee for a motorcycle or trailer. In addition to the regular motorcycle or trailer registration fee prescribed by law, the initial contribution for the sportsman registration plate is \$20, which must be deposited with the Treasurer of State and credited as follows:
  - A. Fourteen dollars to the Outdoor Recreational Access Protection Fund established in Title 12, section 10262;
  - B. Five dollars to the Highway Fund for administrative and production costs; and
  - C. One dollar to the Specialty License Plate Fund established under section 469.
- 3. Renewal fee. Except as provided in subsection 3-A, and in addition to the regular motor vehicle registration fee prescribed by law, the annual renewal contribution for sportsman registration plates is \$20, which must be deposited with the Treasurer of State and credited as follows:
  - A. Eighteen dollars credited as follows:
    - (1) Fifty percent to the fish hatchery maintenance fund established in Title 12, section 10252;
    - (2) Fifteen percent to the Boat Launch Facilities Fund established in Title 12, section 10261;
    - (3) Ten percent to the Maine Endangered and Nongame Wildlife Fund established in Title 12, section 10253; and
    - (4) Twenty-five percent to the Support Landowners Program in Title 12, section 10108, subsection 4, paragraph A;
  - B. One dollar to the Highway Fund for administrative and production costs; and
  - C. One dollar to the Specialty License Plate Fund established under section 469.
- 3-A. Renewal fee for a motorcycle or trailer. In addition to the regular motorcycle or trailer registration fee prescribed by law, the annual renewal contribution for the sportsman registration plate is \$20, which must be deposited with the Treasurer of State and credited as follows:
  - A. Fourteen dollars to the Outdoor Recreational Access Protection Fund established in Title 12, section 10262;
  - B. Five dollars to the Highway Fund for administrative and production costs; and
  - C. One dollar to the Specialty License Plate Fund established under section 469.
- **4. Issuance.** The Secretary of State shall issue a sportsman registration plate in a number or letter sequence or a combination of a number and letter sequence.
- **5. Design and approval.** Notwithstanding section 468, subsection 5, the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife shall submit a new proposed design for the sportsman registration plate every 6 years for approval or modification by the Secretary of State.

- 6. **Transfer of fees.** On a quarterly basis, the Secretary of State shall transfer the revenue from the issuance and renewal of the sportsman registration plates to the Treasurer of State for deposit and crediting pursuant to subsections 2, 2-A, and 3 and 3-A.
- 7. Eligibility; Motorcycle and Trailer. A sportsman registration plate may be issued for a motorcycle registered pursuant to section 515 or a trailer registered pursuant section 511.

## Sec. 3. 12 MRSA §468, sub-§ 10, is amended to read:

10. Additional versions or classes of the specialty plate. Except for sportsman registration plates issued for motorcycle or trailer under section 656-C, sub-section 7 or otherwise provided by law, all requirements set forth in this section must be followed for each additional class or version of a specialty plate.

## **SUMMARY**

This proposal creates the Outdoor Recreational Access Protection Fund within the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife for the purpose of acquiring real property to ensure access for recreational opportunities that are licensed by the department. It also extends the sportsman registration plate to include motorcycles and trailers and dedicates a portion of the registration fee to the Outdoor Recreational Access Protection Fund.
