## §1310-G. Time schedules for closure of existing facilities

The department shall establish, as part of a municipal landfill closure and remediation plan, reasonable time schedules for the implementation of the plan. [PL 1993, c. 732, Pt. C, §18 (AMD).]

- 1. Criteria. In establishing the time schedule, the department shall consider the following criteria:
- A. The level of environmental and public health hazard posed by the landfill in its current state; [PL 1987, c. 517, §25 (NEW).]
- B. The availability of reasonable, alternative disposal options available to the municipality following closure of the existing landfill; [PL 1993, c. 732, Pt. C, §18 (AMD).]
- C. The period reasonably needed by the municipality to raise its share of plan costs; and [PL 1993, c. 732, Pt. C, §18 (AMD).]
- D. The availability of state cost-share funds for the project. [PL 1993, c. 732, Pt. C, §18 (NEW).] [PL 1993, c. 732, Pt. C, §18 (AMD).]
