I have witnessed the effect of hunger at home on children and their learning. Their families also depend on school food distribution organized by social workers and administrators who regularly collect non-perishable foods and send them home with kids before weekends and vacations. The disruption to this kind of food distribution was the most severe impact of the pandemic back in 2020.

Please find the political will to do this. We all know that the resources exist but state government gives tax breaks to mega-wealthy corporations rather than feeding families.
