Please allow me a moment to introduce myself. My name is Chief Bill Gillespie, and I am the Legislative Liaison for the Maine Fire Chiefs Association and Chief of the Liberty Fire Department. I am testifying on behalf of the more than 400 Fire Chiefs in Maine. Please allow this written submission of testimony <u>in support</u> of LD 242. Thank you, Senator Cyrway, for sponsoring this bill.

## An Act to Support the Maine Fire Protection Services Commission

This bill has had a tremendous impact on Maine firefighters. Over the past 3 years with your support we have started the process of replacing Maine's aging fire training facilities with a safer and more realistic option. The past options of burning acquired structures have become increasingly more difficult and expensive for small communities due to environmental restrictions.

In the 128<sup>th</sup> session you unanimously supported our plans to bring Live Fire Training Facilities within reasonable travel for firefighters in the State. We have been able to complete 2 training facilities and put them in operation in 2020. For 2021 we have plans for a third training building.

When we stood before this committee in 2018, we looked at this as a 10-year plan to build 11 training facilities. While under review in the Appropriations and Financial Affairs Committee, a compromise was reached to add a sunset prevision of 3 years to allow time to review our progress. I hope you agree that we have utilized the funding provided wisely and continue to support your firefighters who have served honorably and courageously though the challenges of this past year.
