According to a 2019 article in Harvard Health Publishing, children as young as three years old may be strong enough to pull the trigger on a handgun. In a 2006 article in Archives of Pediatric and Adolescent Medicine it was reported that three out of four children (including children less than 10 years old) living in a house with a gun know where the gun is, even when the parents think they don't. Children are inquisitive, daring, and impulsive. They rely on adults to keep them safe. The gun owner has the responsibility to secure a gun so that it is inaccessible to and inoperable by children. There must be explicit and enforceable consequences to the gun owner when failing to do this results in death or injury.
