Statement in Opposition to

LD 1298, An Act to Provide Funds for Community-based
Substance Use Disorder Treatment and Recovery Services and
to Reduce by Half the Funding for the Maine Drug
Enforcement Agency

May 12, 2021

Maine's chiefs fully support providing additional funding for community-based substance abuse disorder treatment and recovery services. It is a critical component in the efforts to rid our state of the scourge of illegal and unhealthy drug use. But treatment and recovery efforts alone will not accomplish our goal.

We continue to have a serious opioid crisis, as well as problems with a host of other drugs, both prescription and non-prescription. Equally as important as treatment and recovery is the need to cut off the supply of drugs. There are still all too many people and gangs or syndicates willing to supply the habits of those unfortunate enough to have fallen victim to addiction.

The officers in every police department and sheriff's office spend time and efforts in stemming the flow of drugs, it is but one of our many duties. Having a statewide office dedicated to this effort is essential.

We do not believe that MDEA is spending its time and resources to track down and arrest individuals who possess relatively small amounts of drugs for their own use. Rather, MDEA's work is critical in tracking down the ultimate sources of drugs. We have no reason to believe it has twice the funding it needs to accomplish this mission.

We urge that you seek another source of funds to increase the necessary treatment and recovery services.
