I grew up in Topsham, and returned to Brunswick in 2019 after living out of state for many years. I work as an information professional at a privately-held environmental engineering firm in Portland. I have volunteered at Preble Street in Portland many times, and currently assist monthly at MCHPP in Brunswick. I am excited to learn about LD 1478: An Act To Decriminalize Homelessness, and am urgently asking you to vote in support of this bill.

This critical legislation will ensure that trained mental health and substance use professionals respond to encounters between law enforcement officers and people experiencing homelessness. Further, it will connect people who are experiencing homeless with crisis services, emergency and transitional housing, and case management.
