I am writing in support of Bills LD 1253 and LD 1391, both of which concern the addition of faculty and staff to the Board of Trustees of the University of Maine System.

My classified staff position as a Special Event Coordinator Senior at West Virginia University affords me to opportunity to be part of Staff Council. Classified Staff Councils were established in West Virginia state code on March 8, 2003 with House Bill 2224 for the purpose of "providing the classified employees at each institution a means to share information and discuss issues affecting them or the efficient and effective operations of their institution with the President of the institution and its Board of Governors." I also currently serve as the classified staff representative on the West Virginia University Board of Governors. My position on the board is an elected one by my classified staff peers and I receive the full rights and voting privileges that all other members of our Board have including the faculty and student representatives. Our governing board consists of 17 members of which 13 are appointed by our governor, two faculty, one student and one classified staff. The appointed members represent several different careers and backgrounds which makes for a vast knowledge base and experience. As different as each are to one another, the opposite is true when it comes to doing what is in the best interest of West Virginia University.

As the classified staff representative, the knowledge I have is valued by other board members who may not fully understand the day-to-day operations of the University.
