Re: L.D. 1632 An Act To Update the Laws Regarding the Maine

Educational Center for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing and the Governor

Baxter School for the Deaf

Dear Senator Rafferty, Representative Brennan, and Members of the Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs:

Thank you for the opportunity for Disability Rights Maine (DRM) to provide testimony in support of this legislation. DRM's mission is to ensure autonomy, inclusion, equality and access for people with disabilities in Maine.

I am the program director for DRM's Deaf Services. I work every day on behalf of individuals who are Deaf, Hard of Hearing and Late-Deafened. I myself am Deaf and a former student of the Governor Baxter School for the Deaf.

LD 1632 makes necessary updates to Chapter 304, the rules which govern the Maine Educational Center for the Deaf & Hard of Hearing (MECDHH) and the Governor Baxter School for the Deaf (GBSD). This bill would ensure that appropriate services are provided statewide for Deaf and Hard of Hearing children through MECDHH/GBSD, and clarifies funding responsibilities for those services.

In particular, we support the move to embed MECDHH/GBSD into early intervention and education plans for children. This is an important change. We believe it will positively impact the education of Deaf and Hard of Hearing children in Maine.
