There is a bidirectional correlation between oral health diseases and many diseases of inflammation such as diabetes and cardiovascular diseases to name two. Tooth decay is the number one preventable disease of children in the country and when untreated it progresses to debilitating disease and can be fatal. If we did not have midlevel providers of medical care in this state such as nurse practitioners or physician's assistants, many of us would not have a medical home. The problem is the same for those in need of a dental home. There is an extreme need for access to oral health care that cannot be ignored any longer and this bill will help to increase the number of midlevel dental therapists in the state of Maine.
