To the honorable Chairs, Senators Rafferty and Brennan, and the other members of the committee:

Thank you for your consideration of LD 1642, an Act to Strengthen the Teaching of Wabanaki Studies in Maine Schools. Before my career change, I was a school-teacher in Maine, and cared deeply about bringing forward indigenous topics in the classroom. While there was officially legislation supporting this work, there were no on-the-ground supports for me at that time.

This bill truly supports teachers by instituting trainings and putting forward clear topics and goals for study. This bill also makes a financial commitment to the new curriculum. Instead of yet another out-of-pocket cost for teachers, this bill provides permanent funding to support the change.
