## Testimony by State Senator Matthea Daughtry on LD 489 RESOLUTION, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of Maine To Establish a Right to a Healthy Environment

Presented to the Joint Standing Committee on Environment and Natural Resources Monday, March 8, 2021

Senator Brenner, Representative Tucker, and Distinguished Members of the Joint Standing Committee on Environment and Natural Resources:

My name is Mattie Daughtry. I am the State Senator for Senate District #24, which includes the towns of Brunswick, Freeport, Harpswell, North Yarmouth, and Pownal. I am pleased to support LD 489, *RESOLUTION, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of Maine To Establish a Right to a Healthy Environment*. LD 489 is also commonly known as the Pine Tree Amendment.

Here in Maine, our way of life is largely determined by our environment. Whether you're an avid outdoorsman or registered Maine guide, a local trail runner or just simply like to enjoy our natural resources, folks in Maine appreciate and rely on the outdoors.
