Written testimony will be submitted after the hearing; however key points are:

1. This well-intended bill has the effect of reducing the discretion of the EMT in deciding how to prioritize its efforts through extremely specific directives. The Legislature should be very cautious in doing so.
2. The bill removes the limited use of RGGI funds for low-income weatherization and greatly expands the potential use of electric ratepayer funds for weatherizing homes heated by fossil fuels. This cross-subsidy must stop and certainly should not be expanded. IECG will oppose ALL efforts to have electric ratepayers provide further subsidies for fossil-fuel customers until conservation/conversion surcharges are in place for these fuels.
