My family, as well as my husband's, go back generations in commercial fishing. Fishing is in our roots and our blood. This is who we are.

I'm writing you today, pleading for help! Maine's fishing communities need support! Our voices aren't being heard with our concerns regarding the offshore windmills. I'm writing in hopes our concerns are taken into consideration.

Much like farming and logging, commercial fishing doesn't have the support it deserves. With one of the biggest revenues in Maine why would our Governor want to destroy it? Does she realize the trickle down affect this is going to create?

Boat builders, marine stores, grocery stores, car dealerships, tourism, construction, restaurants; these are just a few examples of businesses that will be drastically impacted.

The Windmill project will be devastating for thousands of livelihoods and also for the sea life. Did you know Eastern Egg Rock is the home to hundreds of puffins?
