Testimony of John Macauley in opposition of LD 1465: An Act to Amend the Calculation of Tariff Rates and Billing Credits Under Net Energy Billing

Senator Lawrence, Representative Zeigler, and honorable members of the Energy, Utility, and Technology Committee.

I am John Macauley, Head Selectmen for the Town of Mount Desert. Thank you for providing me with this opportunity to oppose LD 1465: An Act to Amend the Calculation of Tariff Rates and Billing Credits Under Net Energy Billing.

This bill works directly against Mount Desert's and Maine's climate goals. Our Town has identified solar energy as an integral part of our Climate Action Plan. The Town of Mount Desert is actively pursuing three new Town-owned solar projects across our municipality. Our solar projects are an important step toward our goal of freeing the municipality from its reliance on fossil fuels. These projects are economically feasible because of the tariff net energy billing rate structure. This bill proposes to dramatically change the tariff rate in a way that reduces the savings provided by our proposed projects and may prevent them from reaching fruition altogether.

LD 1465 does not seek to serve the best interests of Maine ratepayers, but rather the utilities who oversee them. The cost of Maine's net energy billing is a fraction of our electric bills, 1-2%, depending on territory. This contrasts with the 50-60% of the bill that goes to pay for the natural gas dominant supply in the regional market.

Finally, last session, this legislature passed LD 1986: An Act Relating to Net Energy Billing and Distributed Solar and Energy Storage Systems. This policy must take effect before changes around net energy billing proceed. If changes occur, as presented in LD 1465, they will be costly to our ratepayers and our climate. For these reasons, I urge this committee to vote against the passage of LD 1465: An Act to Amend the Calculation of Tariff Rates and Billing Credits Under Net Energy Billing.
