COMMITTEE AMENDMENT “ ” to S.P. 158, L.D. 372, “An Act To Provide Maine Children Access to Affordable Health Care”

Amend the bill by striking out all of sections 1 and 2.

Amend the bill in section 3 in §3174-T in subsection 1 in the 3rd line (page 1, line 27 in L.D.) by striking out the following: “, 2-A or 2-B”

Amend the bill in section 3 in §3174-T in subsection 2 in paragraph A in the last line (page 1, line 39 in L.D.) by striking out the following: “200% 300%” and inserting the following: ‘200%’

Amend the bill in section 3 in §3174-T in subsection 2 by striking out all of paragraph F (page 3, lines 21 and 22 in L.D.).

Amend the bill in section 3 in §3174-T by striking out all of subsection 2-A (page 3, lines 23 to 29 in L.D.).

Amend the bill in section 3 in §3174-T by striking out all of subsection 2-B (page 3, lines 30 to 36 in L.D.).

Amend the bill in section 3 in §3174-T in subsection 7 in the last 4 lines (page 5, lines 6 to 9 in L.D.) by striking out the following: “In addition, the department shall apply for additional federal funds available for Medicaid outreach activities. The goal of outreach activities under this subsection is to enroll 100% of children eligible for the Cub Care program or the MaineCare program.”

Amend the bill by striking out all of sections 4 and 5.

Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

**SUMMARY**

This amendment, which is the minority report of the committee, makes the following changes to the bill.

**COMMITTEE AMENDMENT**

- 1           1. It keeps the maximum eligibility level for family income under the Cub Care  
2 program at 200% of the federal poverty level, which is the amount established in current  
3 law.
- 4           2. It removes the provision that eligibility is not subject to an asset test because current  
5 rules do not make eligibility subject to an asset test.
- 6           3. It removes the requirement to provide coverage to persons 19 and 20 years of age  
7 and to noncitizens under 21 years of age.
- 8           4. It removes the requirement that the Department of Health and Human Services seek  
9 federal funds for outreach activities and removes the goal of outreach activities.
