We serve residents in nursing homes, assisted housing including residential cate assisted living facilities, adult day programs and recipients of home care services. Additive serve patients in hospitals who experience barriers in accessing long-term services a supports.

We are pleased to provide testimony in support of these regulations for Assisted Housing

Early in the pandemic, we worked with the Department of Health and Human Services Aging and Disability Services, Division of Licensing and Certification and Maine CDC out infection control surveys in all long-term care facilities across the state. This was he determining infection control practices and providing education to assist facilities to ca best practices in infection control. Additionally, the Office of Aging and Disability Ser engaged infection control consultants to support facilities with infection control and propractices.

These regulations are critical in guiding Assisted Housing Programs through the pander protecting residents from COVID-19.
