Fiscal Detail and Notes

The Department of Health and Human Services will require General Fund appropriations of \$31,234 in fiscal year 2020-21, \$148,115 in fiscal year 2021-22 and \$147,806 in fiscal year 2022-23 for the Department of Health and Human Services to amend its reimbursement rate under the MaineCare program for dental code 41899 to \$1,250 per procedure for freestanding ambulatory surgical centers performing procedures on the dentoalveolar structure. Federal Expenditures Fund allocations will also be required for the FMAP match.

As this is an emergency bill, this estimate assumes an April 1, 2021 effective date. The costs in SFY 2020-21 will change with the effective date.
