A case manager's starting wage is just over \$17.00 per hour, and one has to have a Bachelor's Degree for this role. I went to a four year college to be making slightly more than someone at McDonald's, except they presumably don't have thousands of dollars in student debt. It is utterly defeating. I do not take pity upon myself. I chose to be a case manager to advocate and support those with autism and intellectual disabilities. I am, however, concerned how this turnover directly impacts the lives of those with disabilities. The revolving door of case managers makes service delivery inconsistent and erodes trust.
