The rate of reimbursement for MaineCare is one of the *five lowest in the U.S. at* \$50.40/*hour*. This compares with the national average of \$95 per hour, with some states as high as \$162. As far as we can determine, it has been at least 20 years since OT rates were increased.

Impact on Clinic Owners

"In the past month one of my therapists resigned to go to work in hand therapy in a hospital instead of in pediatrics for better pay and benefits. While interviewing to fill her position, I interviewed a therapist making \$60 per hour as a per diem therapist, more then we are reimbursed per hour. "It is extremely difficult to continue providing services at the MaineCare reimbursement rate. Each year I struggle with whether our clinic needs to cap the number of children on MaineCare, thereby putting on waiting lists.
