ISSUES FROM TESTIMONY AND SUGGESTED AMENDMENT:

- DOE regarding BHPs in school-based settings:
 - o Would limit capacity of schools to provide quality school-based BHP programming options
 - o These services are required to be provided this medically necessary service in order to access their education
 - o Would require direct supervision of all school-based BHPs at all times, which means fewer students could be serviced
 - Legislation conflicts with DOE rules related to responsibilities and supervision requirements of the three levels of Education Technicians
 - Suggested amendment: Include a provision for children's school-based BHP treatment conditional certification (requiring 90 credit hours and Education Technician III certification) for applicants meeting some certification requirements, with a plan and timeline to complete the remainder of the certification requirements, similar to the structure currently in place for conditional special education teacher certification
