LD 1550: An Act To End the Sale of Flavored Tobacco Products Testimony of Eben Francis Indian Island, Penobscot Nation May 7, 2021

Senator Claxton, Representative Meyer, and honorable members of the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services: my name is Eben Francis, I live on Indian Island, in Penobscot Nation and I am here today to testify in favor of LD 1550, An Act To End the Sale of Flavored Tobacco Products.

In today's world Nicotine and tobacco products are everywhere. According to truthiniative.org 16.1% of American Indian and Alaska Native middle schoolers use e-cigarettes. As if that statistic wasn't large enough 40.4% of American Indian and Alaska native high school students use e-cigarettes. I am 13 years old and am from the Penobscot Nation. In Penobscot culture we use tobacco as a way to give thanks. It is sad to see something of cultural significance be used to exploit young people. Even as a 13 year old I know people my age who have used e-cigarettes or tobacco products.
