I was around when Polio was an issue and children were becoming very sick. This is not the same situation. Social distancing, hand washing, and even masking has helped in a lot of cases. For me, I was directly exposed by a healthcare worker who had COVID but was still working due to the CDC guidelines- if anything we should probably be looking at those guidelines before we mandate anything else.
