My name is Donna Dodge. I am a Registered Dietitian who has not renewed my license in the state of Maine. This is not my choice. I was denied the right to work in Maine because I refused to take an experimental injection that, according to VAERS data, has harmed one million people in less than a year. I was told that because of current regulations, my employer had to "draw a line in the sand," and that my request was not possible.

I am now working in New Hampshire where my request for an exemption was granted.

I will never relinquish my right to determine what is put into my body, especially as a condition of employment.

Mandating this injection is a crime against humanity. Under no circumstance should a government ever possess that kind of power.

This injection does not stop transmission, it does not stop infection. At best it might lessen symptoms. Never before have we mandated a risky medical intervention for healthy people for the goal of lessening symptoms. I ask, "Why mandate a product if it clearly is not shown to offer protection of transmission? What is to be gained by a mandate except to lose more healthcare staff?"

LD867 will help to preserve our Bill of Rights, it will protect our inalienable right to Liberty and informed consent. It will allow people like myself to again work in Maine.

I recommend LD 867 ought to pass.
